

And, Either-or, or, & One of

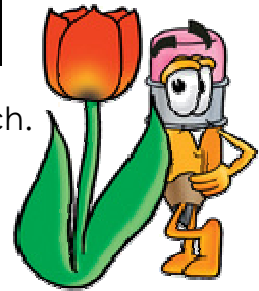
Remember, "either-or", "neither-nor", "or" and "one of" are talking about "one" not a group, While "and" & "as well as" speak of "more than one"
